Subject: -Grant of Extended Permission to Dayanand Ayurvedic College, Mahatma Hans Raj Marg, G.T. Road, Opp. Burlton Park, Distt. Jalandhar-144008, Punjab (Inst. ID-AYU0219) with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 10 seats in 02 PG courses the subject namely (i) Panchkarma -05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Dayanand Ayurvedic College, Mahatma Hans Raj Marg, G.T. Road, Opp. Burlton Park, Distt. Jalandhar-144008, Punjab (Inst. ID-AYU0219) inspection was conducted on 24.03.2025 and 25.03.2025 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 10 seats in 02 PG courses the subject namely (i) Panchkarma -05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 05 seats for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the "Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-
- Teaching staffs:-
- a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted is $\frac{Available}{Required}x100\% =$ $\frac{29}{22}x100\% = 96.6\%$ (Excluding Excess)
- b) Shortcoming is as under-

3) The assessment report was duly placed in the 121th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 25.04.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue extended permission with intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) Course and 10 seats in 02 PG courses the subject namely (i) Panchkarma -05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic year 2025-26 as the college has been permitted consecutively for previous three years after fulfilling the conditions as specified in the concerned Regulations.

"DECISION"

4) Therefore, Extended permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024, Regulaton 15 (5) of MESAR PG 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 and 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to Dayanand Ayurvedic College, Mahatma Hans Raj Marg, G.T. Road, Opp. Buriton Park, Distt. Jalandhar-144008, Punjab (Inst. ID-AYU0219) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 10 seats in 02 PG courses the subject namely (i) Panchkarma -05 seats (ii) Dravyaguna Vigyana - 05 seats for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-

- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 60 seats and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 10 PG seats in 02 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 5) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 7) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 8) The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the process of issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
 - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.

iv) The shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 2 shall be fulfilled.

v) The remaining visitation fee as communicated in the letter 28.01.2025.

9) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
